This meet is a sanctioned, open championship YMCA meet. The Westport Weston Family Y Strittmatter Natatorium is configured as a 10 lane, 25 yard course. Water depth at start is 9' and at turn end is 4'. Colorado Timing System with full color scoreboard will be used. The competition course has been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C (4). Copy of such certification is on file with USA Swimming.



Warm-up/Warm-down will be available in two (2) 20yd lanes of the family/teaching pool.

Spectator seating is available off deck and TBD. Amount of spectator seating TBD upon all meet entries having been received.

Swimmer holding area for excess numbers is located in the spectator area. No personal chairs are allowed on the pool deck. The pool deck has minimal seating available, but swimmers will be able to come down to talk with their coach preand post-race.

Handicap parking is available near the front of the facility. Handicap accessibility is available into the spectator area. An elevator is conveniently located just off the lobby to access the youth locker rooms on the lower level.

Free guest WiFi is available. No spectator fee. Programs will be available for free on Meet Mobile.

- > Timers will be needed from visiting teams. Swimmers will need to provide his/her own timer for the 500yd Freestyle and 400 Ind. Medley.
- > Parking will be available in the main Y parking lot. More specific parking instructions will be sent out to teams prior to the meet.

- ➤ This meet is open to Y teams out of the Connecticut Y League.
- > Kid's Club will NOT be available for non-Westport Weston Family Y members.

<u>Please Note:</u> This USA/CT Swimming approved meet will not count toward the regular scheduled sanctioned meet eligibility requirement for CSI championships (Regional Championships and Age Group Championship). This meet does not count toward the eligibility requirement of Connecticut Swimming Scholar Athlete, Athlete Travel Assistance, or other CSI recognition programs with meet eligibility requirements. This meet will not count toward the regularly scheduled sanctioned meet eligibility requirement for CT Zone Team selection. Times attained at this meet cannot be used for Short Course Zone Team qualification and selection.

ELIGIBILITY

ATHLETE

YMCA Membership: An athlete must be a YMCA member in good standing who holds an annual, full privilege membership at the YMCA he/she represents for a period of at least 30 days prior to the first day of the meet.

<u>Amateur Status</u>: An athlete may not have represented a college, university or other post-high school institution in any competition and may not have accepted pay or compensation for competing as a swimmer.

<u>Unattached Athletes</u>: There is no unattached status in YMCA Swimming.

CIAC High School Swimmer events should be noted as "Exhibition"

Age: An athlete must be the correct age for the age specified events. The "Open" events are open to swimmers 13 & over.

YMCA Meet Participation: Must be a current member of a YMCA.

Athletes with a Disability: Swimmers with a disability are welcome to enter this meet. The coach or team entry person must alert the meet director and the meet referee as to the need for any special accommodations or seeding arrangements at the time the entry is submitted. If modifications to USA Swimming rules are necessary, then the coach or athlete must notify the meet referee of any disability prior to competition.

COACH

Required Certifications: Coaches must hold current certifications in the following courses in order to receive a deck credential: Professional Rescuer



CPR, First Aid, Safety Training for Swim Coaches (a Lifeguard certification may be used if accompanied by completion of the Safety Training for Swim Coaches online content) and Principles of YMCA Competitive Swimming and Diving. A list of the acceptable certifications can be found in the Swimming Addendum to the Rules That Govern Competitive Sport.

<u>Coach Registration</u>: Each coach must have completed the annual YMCA on-line coach registration process. Coaches who are not registered and approved will not be permitted on deck.

<u>Teams without A Coach at the Meet:</u> All athletes and teams must have at least one certified and credentialed YMCA coach designated as being responsible for their supervision during competition. When a YMCA team will not have a coach present, that YMCA may authorize an eligible coach from another YMCA attending the meet to be responsible for their athletes at the meet. The Meet Director and Meet Referee must be notified of this situation.

TEAM

<u>Team Registration</u>: Each team must have completed the annual YMCA online team registration and paid the annual registration fee.

Insurance: Each team that participates in the meet must have a current and correct Certificate of Liability Insurance, in effect through the last day of the meet.

ENTRY INFORMATION

ENTRY LIMITS: Swimmers may participate in three (3) individual events per session no more than five (5) events total – which includes up to two (2) relays.

> Friday Events will not count towards the 3 event limit, nor, will they be scored.

QUALIFICATION PERIOD: None

USA-S IDs: Only USA-S registered athletes should have an ID number in the Meet Entry File.

TIME STANDARDS: None

TIMES: No Times (NT) are not allowed. Submit entry times in Actual Time - no conversion. Times are to be in short course yards – scy.

OVER-SUBSCRIPTION: If the session is oversubscribed, the following protocol will be set in motion in order to reduce the timeline to the required length of participation number.

- > Relay entries may be reduced.
- > The maximum number of events per session may be reduced by one (1).

VOLUNTEERS/OFFICIALS/TIMERS

OFFICIALS AND TIMERS: Participating teams will be asked to supply timers. Officials available to work are asked to contact the Officials Coordinator listed earlier in this meet announcement.

SIGN-UP PROCEDURE: At the entrance to the pool there deck will be a check-in station.



BACKGROUND CHECK POLICY: Coaches will be asked to present their coaching credentials to meet management.

OFFICIAL ATTIRE: White top/Navy bottom

CHECK-IN PROCEDURE

MEET CHECK-IN PROCEDURE: Coaches should be prepared to show credentials when picking up meet packet at the computer table.

EVENT CHECK-IN: Team packets will have scratch sheets for each session for which they are participating. These will be due no later 30 minutes at the start of warm-ups.

COACHES MEETING: As needed

OFFICIALS AND TIMERS MEETING: Timers will be told where and when to meet upon check-in. Officials meeting will be conducted in the Schine Meeting Room.

CHAMPIONSHIP PROCEDURES AND OPERATIONS

CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE: The Committee will consist of the Meet Director, Meet Referee and Coach to be named.

RULES: The meet will run under Rules That Govern YMCA Competitive Sports, Swimming Addendum to the Rules That Govern YMCA Competitive Sports, USA-S Technical Rules.

MEET FORMAT: The meet will be swum as Timed Finals. Swimmer's age will be determined as of the first day of the meet – Friday, January 19, 2024.

➤ 500yd Freestyle and 400 Ind. Medley will run Fastest to Slowest. Alternating gender TBD.

EVENT SEEDING: Events will be seeded Slowest to Fastest, except for the following events: 500yd Freestyle and 400yd Ind. Medley. Alternating gender TBD. The Meet Referee/Administrative Official reserve the right to combine heats.

SCRATCH PROCEDURES: An athlete is considered entered into an event unless he/she scratches from that event. If an athlete does not scratch from an event and does not swim the event, that event still counts toward the athlete's total number of events for the meet.



NO SHOW: An athlete who is seeded in an event and fails to compete in an event will not be penalized from competing in other entered events.

WARM-UP SAFETY PROCEDURES: Teams will be assigned lanes for warm-ups and be given a warm-up schedule. Teams will need to share lane space and work cooperatively in reflection of the YMCA values and sportsmanship.

During designated warm up sessions, athletes may only enter the competition pools from the starting end. Athletes are expected to use a three-point entry in which they sit on the side of the pool then slide into the pool gently, with one hand on the wall. The exception is during specific warm up periods when sprint lanes are designated for practicing racing starts.

Coaches are responsible for the safety of his/her athletes and are expected to monitor them at all times during warm up sessions.

READY BENCH: None

STARTS: 'Fly-over' starts will be used at this meet. All swimmers (except for Backstroke starts) should remain in the water at the completion of their race until the next heat has begun.

Exception will be for the 8 & Under session.

SWIMS (USA-S): This meet has been approved by USA Swimming. Therefore, all individual times will be automatically submitted for entry into SWIMS as long as USA-S ID numbers have been included with your entry.

RESULTS: Any results displayed on the scoreboard are unofficial until final results are published. Results will be posted.

PROTEST PROCEDURE: Protests may only be initiated by a person with standing, that is, a coach or YMCA supervisor whose team is competing in the meet. The Championship committee will arbitrate protests, eligibility issues, safety rules and other issues.

Protests against the judgment decisions of starters, stroke, turn, place and relay take-off judges can only be considered by the Referee and the Referee's decisions will be final USA-S Rule 102.23).

CONDUCT AND RESTRICTIONS: The Meet Referee reserves the right to dismiss any swimmer, coach and/or spectator from the competition due to inappropriate conduct.



- Deck access is limited to only registered and approved coaches, swimmers, and working officials.
- Except where the venue facilities require otherwise, changing, into or out of swimsuits other than in locker rooms or other designated areas is not appropriate and is prohibited. The USA Swimming Rulebook defines Deck Change as: Changing, in whole or in part, into or out of a swimsuit (excluding a drag suit) in an area other than a permanent or temporary locker room, bathroom, changing room or other space designated for changing purposes while at a practice, competition, or other pool-related activity." This includes slipping off the top of a one-piece performance suit to place on an alternate bikini top immediately following a race.
- Glass, Food, and Chairs are not permitted on deck.
- The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
- Photographs are not allowed to be taken behind the block during competition.
- Massage tables are not permitted.
- Individuals are responsible for the security of their personal belongings and are encouraged not to bring valuables to the meet venue and not to leave items unattended.
- Swimmers are not permitted in the spectator stands.
- Shaving is not permitted in any areas of the facility.

<u>Please Note:</u> Meet Management has the full authority to restrict any and all photography and visual recording at the meet. Photography or video recording (using cameras, video cameras, iPads, cell phones, etc.) from the deck is prohibited by all individuals other than participating Coach and Athlete Members unless prior authorization from the Meet Referee or his/her designee has been granted. Flash photography is prohibited during the start of any heat, including whenever any swimmer is stepping up or standing on a block for the purpose of the start of a heat.

Additionally, the following "Non-Camera Zones" shall be enforced:

- Photography or video recording and the use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
- Photography or video recording (using cameras, video cameras, iPads, cell phones, etc) is not permitted in the area immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) while they are in use for "race starting purposes" during competition and warm-ups.



Additional "Non-Camera Zones" may be designated by Meet Management.
 Any individual failing to abide by these rules may be ejected from the facility and be subject to a Code of Conduct violation at the discretion of Meet Management.

TIME TRIALS

FORMAT AND FEE: At the discretion of the Meet Committee. Time Trials are open only to athletes entered in the Championship meet.

An athlete may only swim the stroke being contested in a Time Trials event, e.g. an athlete may not swim backstroke in a breaststroke event in Time Trials.

- ➤ If provided, a time trial will count as one of the swimmer's allotted number of events.
- ➤ If provided, the cost is \$20.00 per individual event and \$40.00 per relay

> If provided, coaches will be made aware of the entry procedure.

LOST AND FOUND: As needed

CONDUCT AND RESTRICTIONS:



- No Flash Photography at the start of competition races.
- No personal chairs are allowed in the spectator area.
- Parents are responsible for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed to roam the facility unattended.
- The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
- Spectators are not permitted on deck.
- No smoking, drugs, or alcohol are permitted in the swimming complex.

LIABILITY, SAFETY AND EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

INSURANCE: Each Association participating in this meet must have insurance coverage for representative(s) including leadership and participants who will be in attendance for the period of the meet. Appendix 3 must be signed by each association participating in the meet.

LIABILITY LIMITS:

- In granting of the USA-S/CSI approval, it is understood and agreed that USA Swimming and CSI, Inc. shall be free and held harmless from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the meet.
- In granting the YMCA Sanctioning, it is understood and agreed that YMCA of the USA shall be free and held harmless from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the meet.
- Each participating Y must submit prior to the meet a Certificate of Insurance.

EMERGENCIES: The facility personnel will handle all emergencies at the meet. These individuals will provide CPR and first aid as needed and will ensure that individuals with serious injuries are transported immediately to the nearest hospital for further treatment. Defibrillators will be on site. Any coach, athlete or official who recognizes an emergency situation should immediately inform the facility's personnel and then make sure the vicinity of the emergency is clear for the emergency personnel to do their job.

UNACCOMPANIED ATHLETE: Each athlete must have a certified coach responsible for him/her while on the pool deck. The coach of the athlete must authorize in writing a coach from another team to represent their team and be responsible for the swimmer(s).



CONCUSSION AWARENESS: This meet will follow the YMCA of USA Concussion procedure. Anyone who observes or has knowledge of a potential head injury should immediately notify lifeguards and/or hired medical personnel. Once the injury report is completed, the lifeguard and/or hired medical personnel will notify the Event Staff, the athlete's coaching staff, and the Meet Director.

If a head injury occurs, the action plan below will be followed:

- 1. Athlete is removed immediately from participation by the Meet Director.
- 2. Athlete must be evaluated by a licensed health care professional experienced in identifying and treating concussions. In addition, the athlete must be in compliance with the laws that are in effect within the jurisdiction where the meet is held.
- 3. The coaching staff will inform the athlete's parents or guardians about the possible concussion and give or send them the fact sheet on concussion.
- 4. The athlete will not be allowed back to warm-up or compete until a health care professional, experienced in evaluating concussions determines that the athlete is symptom-free and is OK to return to participation.

LIGHTNING POLICY: The National Lightning Safety Institute, National Athletic Trainers Association, American College of Emergency Physicians, USA Swimming, and YMCA of the USA all recommend or require closing an indoor pool during an electrical storm. This policy will be followed at the meet.

DRONES: Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.

EVACUATION PROCEDURE: Through the emergency doors provided on the pool deck.

DIRECTIONS:

The Westport Weston Family Y at Mahackeno is located directly off Exit 41 – northbound – of the Merritt Parkway.

I-95: From north or south, left turn off exit ramp. Follow up to the Merritt Parkway – Route 15. Get in the right lane and turn onto what looks to be the on ramp for the Merritt Parkway but stay in the right lane.

> You will be able to drop your child off at the front of the building but will then proceed to meet parking area.
